Code Enforcement Officer Report: 8 permits to date. CEO D. Richards spoke about Clean Energy Communities. CEC allows a town our size to apply for a grant of up to \$50,000 if we meet 4 out of 10 high impact actions. High impact actions vary and can include LED lighting for street lights, bench marking, track fuel/energy consumption for the town, also campaigning for solar, training for the CEO, carport charging stations. Darren also spoke to J. Photenhauer in regards to the 59 vs 60 mile radius of the no fly zone input by Fort Drum. Town of Colton is 1 mile away from it. Attempting to get more information on this for the possibility of wind towers.
